Purpose: A School of Osteopathic Medicine (SOM) must provide its students/learners with access to diagnostic, preventive and therapeutic health services, accessible in all locations where students receive education from the SOM.

Policy Statement

1) Description

The University of the Incarnate Word School of Osteopathic Medicine (UIWSOM) dedicated to providing a holistic support to balance personal well-being to promote learner excellence, academic, personal and professional development.

2) Primary goals

a) Wellness

To emphasize personal holistic wellness in attending to the mind, body, and spirit. With the physical and emotional demands of this program, positive well-being and good health habits are vital to influence a learner's academic performance, emotional adjustment, and being prepared for their future professional functioning.

- Positively impact learner functioning and provide access to services and resources at all learning locations, to better prepare learners to address their health and attend to their well-being.
- ii) Providing services for the learners in different areas of wellness that include: mental, emotional, social, physical activity, sleep hygiene, and nutrition.
- b) Treatment of Students by Faculty
 - i) Healthcare providers of medical or psychological/psychiatric care and records will have no role in the evaluation or progression of osteopathic medical learners throughout their academic curriculum. (See Element 9.10)

c) Privacy

- i) All student personal healthcare records will be protected by the Family Educational Record and Privacy Act (FERPA) and Health Insurance Portability and Accountability Act (HIPAA). Again, all healthcare providers of sensitive medical or psychological/psychiatric care and records will have no role in evaluation or progression of medical students through their academic curriculum, to ensure the strictest standards of patient privacy and confidentiality, without concern for adverse consequences or repercussion.
- ii) All applicable Federal and Texas State laws regarding the privacy of learner health and all records are private according to HIPAA and FERPA.
 - (1) HIPAA: The major goal of the Privacy Rule is to assure that individuals' health information is properly protected while allowing the flow of health information needed to provide and promote high quality health care and to protect the public's health and well-being. The Rule strikes a balance that permits important uses of information, while protecting the privacy of people who seek care and healing. Given that the health care marketplace is diverse, the Rule is designed to be flexible and comprehensive to cover the variety of uses and disclosures that need to be addressed. https://www.hhs.gov/hipaa/for-professionals/privacy/index.html
 - (2) FERPA: The Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA) (20 U.S.C. § 1232g; 34 CFR Part 99) is a Federal law that protects the privacy of student education records. The law applies to all schools that receive funds under an applicable program of the U.S. Department of Education. FERPA gives parents certain rights with respect to their children's education records. These rights transfer to the student when he or she reaches the age of 18 or attends a school beyond the high school level. Students to whom the rights have transferred are "eligible students."


