Interpreting the Data

- Family medicine is a specialty with opportunities to meet the needs of most aspiring physicians. It has the largest number of residency programs of any specialty (Freeman, 2019).
- The personal statement is very important. It should be error free and should communicate your values and passion for serving others (Freeman, 2019). It should also be used to convey your strong commitment to family medicine.
- While board scores are always important, applicants can match into family medicine with COMLEX scores as low as 400 (NRMP, 2020a).
- Letters of recommendation viewed as being very important. At least one letter should come from a family physician, but letters from physicians can be used in addition to family physician letters (Freeman, 2019).
- It is important to perform well in all core rotations, Achieving honors in the family medicine and rural/underserved rotations may be especially helpful.
- Evidence of a commitment to community service is important for family medicine applications (Freeman, 2019). Becoming involved in community service projects can be helpful. Having a strong background in community service during undergrad is also helpful.
