# Interpreting the Data

- OB-GYN is a reasonably competitive specialty. As such applicants should aim to do as well as possible in board exams.
- USMLE scores are valued by program directors in OB-GYN and DO applicants should consider taking USMLE exams.
- Letters of recommendation are viewed as being very important in this specialty. Applicants should have strong letters from at least two OB-GYNs (Freeman, 2019).
- Applicants should aim to do well in all core rotations and achieve honors grade in their OB-GYN rotation. Applicants interested in this specialty should seek to schedule addition OB-GYN rotations early in fourth year in order to gain more experience and secure letters of recommendation.
- The personal statement is an important aspect of the OB-GYN application. Applicants should seek to convey their passion for their specialty and highlight the role their extracurricular activities had in making them committed to issues relating to women's health.
