Interpreting the Data

- Board scores are important considerations for pediatrics. Outstanding scores are not required, but students should aim to do as well as possible.
- The USMLE exam is generally not required for osteopathic students to match into pediatrics, as evidenced by 87% of program directors valuing COMLEX Level 1. As program directors take failed board exam attempts into consideration, there is a strong argument to be made for only taking COMLEX in order to avoid failing one or even both exams due to being overstretched.
- Letters of recommendation are valued by program directors in pediatrics.
 Applicants should have strong letters from at least two pediatricians (Freeman, 2019).
- Applicants should aim to do well in all core rotations and achieve an honors grade in their pediatric rotation.
 Applicants interested in pediatrics should schedule additional pediatric rotations and sub-internships as part early in fourth year.
- The personal statement should convey the applicant's passion for pediatrics, but it should be more comprehensive than simply "I love working with kids" (Freeman, 2019).
