Esther Shin, OMS II: discuss delayed immune reconstitution and its impact on waning immunity to routine childhood vaccines among pediatric non-transplant cancer survivors, indicating the need for re-vaccination.

Johnathon Trapp, OMS II: presenting a case report on an 11-year-old girl with Turner syndrome who was found to have a proximal left subclavian aneurysm and underwent a successful posterior thoracotomy for aneurysmal repair and small cohort of pediatric patients who underwent a minimally invasive sternotomy repair of various congenital cardiac defects, examining surgical outcomes including pain, length of admission, and number days on Precedex, and post-operative blood products administered, compared with a traditional median sternotomy approach for repair of congenital cardiac defects of a matched group of patients.
